SEN students who come from all over Shropshire, so keeping them engaged is essential for us. The bikes from Quest 88 have been integral to the students' development as they are so inclusive and they can all access and experience them on a daily basis. My students use them every Thursday afternoon and are always excited when they know it is their turn on the bikes – we absolutely love them!
